### Public invited to comment on County Sanitary Sewer Master Plan

*Delaware, Ohio*—The Delaware County Commissioners invite the public to give input at a Public Hearing on the County Sanitary Sewer Master Plan, on Thursday, August 20, from 6:30 to 8:30 pm at Frank D. Willis Building, 2079 US Highway 23 North.

“The Delaware County Regional Sewer District has initiated a sewer master plan update and we encourage public input on development, planning densities, and other concerns as they relate to sanitary sewer,” said Tiffany Jenkins, Director, Environmental Services.

Each person wishing to make public comment will be required to sign in at the beginning of the meeting and will be given 3 minutes to speak. Comment cards may also be completed by those in attendance to be shared with the county consultant and staff.
