Thomas Brown called the June 9, 2004 meeting of the Scioto Township Board of Trustees to order at 7:00 p.m

Thomas Brown asked for a moment of silence in Memory of President, Ronald Reagan.

All in attendance joined in the Pledge of Allegiance.

The minutes of the May 12, 2004 were read. Sandra Stults asked that the \$1500.00 per fire hydrant, stating Del Co Water Company, Inc. furnished their service for installing the hydrants.

FIRE REPORT

Marvin McIntire was not able to get the quotes to talk about the joint fuel system. That will be tabled until the July meeting.

The Fire Levy will be on the July agenda.

Marvin McIntire asked for 3 purchase orders, Boundtree Medical, Moritz Embroidery Works, Inc. and Amsterdam Printing. Boundtree Medical is for airway equipment in the amount of \$2500.00. We did receive an airway grant from the State of Ohio in the amount of \$2,124.83. With these grants you use or lose.

The Moritz Embroidery Works, Inc. in the amount of \$1000.00. Gift items for the 50th celebration to be held August 20th, 21st and 22nd.

Amsterdam Printing in the amount of \$1500.00 also for gift items for the 50th celebration.

OLD BUSINESS

Richard Moxley reported on the Morey Road Ditch will begin as soon as Verizon moves the phone lines.

The report conducted by the county on the road ditch out front of this building came back unfavorable. The engineering is correct. We will improve our grading to make the ditch a nicer looking area.

Richard Moxley received word that the County will put in the hydrant at the bridge in Warrensburg. Bruno Voltolini will pay the \$1500 fee to put a hydrant in his subdivision. Marvin McIntire will have two hydrants for other locations.

NEW BUSINESS

Cemetery- The township had a funeral today using a fiberglass vault, compared to the steel, marble or a rugged vault. Thomas Brown made a motion that Scioto Township exclude the fiberglass or plastic vaults to be used in our cemeteries.

Richard Moxley seconded the motion. Vote: Unanimous.

There will be a 30 day moratorium notice sent to the Funeral Homes as of our decision, beginning today June 9, 2004.

Richard Moxley stated that the roads have been mowed three times,
