

Scioto Township Meeting
April 14, 2010

Chas Kaiser called the April 14, 2010 meeting of the Scioto Township Board of Trustees to order at 7:00 p.m.

All in attendance joined in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Roll call was answered by: Sandra Stults, Rodger C. Finks and Chas Kaiser.

Others in attendance: Andy Zarins, Jim Bennett, Larry Moreland, Brenda Jervis, Mike Knapp, Jason Hutchisson, Bruce, Gwen and Matthew Stayner.

Guests were acknowledged and asked to limit their comments to three (3) minutes. Please direct your questions and/or comments to the Board.

Andy Zarin: 5565 Marysville Road, I am still pursuing the problem with the Lake Hill Private Hunt Club. I've gotten several letters out that you have copies of. They are pretty lengthy letters. I am still pursuing. My opinion at this point nobody seems to have a good handle of the Rifle Shooting Ranges as to what is required and what is not. So I think what it is going to take is you are going to basically a facility that has to be planned, designed and constructed. So if you are going to do that, I think you are actually by laws, you are going to be required to have a set of plans that will be designed by a registered Engineer. They will have to be stamped and signed. They will have to be reviewed and as far as the Engineer designing it could be a problem in a since, cause it is not a very open field. Not very many people do it. Uh, I think you might be hard pressed to find an Engineer that has the experience in that area. But I think on the other and, uh, Engineers are trained on Physics, Geometry, Trigonometry, and Calculus and all kinds of things like that. Uh, and with some research I think they could uh, with typical Generic design age the Civil Engineer could come up with some plans. I think that is what is going to be required and I am going to actually pursue that approach. Uh, then I think the other part of that is you are going to have the plan reviewed and since this area at least it appears to be a rather new problem uh, there is a gentlemen over near Sunbury, I guess, there is a gentlemen in his residential neighborhood has been doing a lot of shooting and his house has been hit twice.

Sandra: That is Trenton Township and that has been resolved.

Andy: Well no, it has not been resolved, it is just getting started. I will have to disagree with you there. Uh, but anyway uh, you apparently got bullets flying across the State Route 604 and you got other houses that have been hit. Uh, the shooter has in fact hit his own building several times. So they are pretty serious about it.

Sandra: In the Columbus Dispatch there was an article stating the shooter stated he was not going to be shooting anymore.

Andy: That was said two (2) years ago too. Sandy, I am sorry I have talked to the gentleman a couple of times. Anyway that's the approach I'm going to take and I believe if there is any type of skeet shooting, especially rifle shooting range, it's going to require a special set of plans designed by an Engineer, reviewed by an Engineer. Like I say the criteria uh, uh, every location is going to be different. In one of my letters I said I was going for the Lake Hill Private Hunt Club. They would have to change their shooting in a westernly direction use the natural embankment and you would still probably need a wall around that probably have to have a shooting station with vertical walls and ceiling. That is the easy part once you lay the geometry, elevation and so forth. The hard part is going to be the noise. My guess is that general starting place would be a twenty (20) foot noise wall. Maybe would have to be lower or maybe higher. Depending on where you are. That's about all I got on that subject. But I notice you have some embankments back here and so I would challenge the Township Trustees to use that as a test site for a shooting range.

Sandra: That is somebody else's land.

Andy: Well, we could talk to those people and see if they have any problem with it.

Chas: Alright Andy!

Andy: You don't like that idea?

Chas: NO, I think you have taken this just a little bit too far. This is not a joke. I don't know where you are going with this.

Andy: Well.

Chas: Why did you even bring it up? This isn't funny.

Andy: Because I saw it. Because at last meeting somebody here said that. Just my suggested opinion that a six (6) foot high embankment isn't high enough.

Chas: Is there any licensing for a Shooting Range that you know of?

Andy: Not that I am aware of. That's part of the problem right there.

Chas: So you need to go "THERE" before coming here.

Andy: Well that's, that's, that's a possibility. What I am saying is that uh, if you are going to design a facility that can endanger the public you are going to need an Engineer for a set of plans, it's just the basics.

Chas: I am sure Lake Hill wasn't designed.

Andy: Well, that's the problem.

Chas: Okay, but how long has it been in existence?

Andy: Well, no.

Chas: That's what we are dealing with here.

Andy: No, we are dealing with a Hunting Club that has been in existence for a long time.

Chas: Okay.

Andy: We are dealing with a Rifle Range that as far as I can tell was maybe only started in the last four (4) months some place in there.

Chas: They hadn't shot rifles over there before?

Andy: They may have but as far as the embankment, it is aimed toward Start Route # 257.

Rodger: We have no proof there wasn't one or there was one.

Andy: Well, one of the first letters I sent I said the first time I saw the embankment was the 2nd of March of this year. Now, I was there several times in November and December and I don't believe for a minute that I wouldn't have seen the embankment if it was there in November.

Rodger: If there was no Rifle Range to start and if they added to, then that becomes a Zoning issue.

Andy: Right.

Rodger: In my mind Lake Hill was there prior to any Zoning. So everything they had at the time is grandfathered in, so to speak.

Andy: Yes, but they have added a lot consonance.

Rodger: Anything added after Zoning came in would have to conform to Zoning. I don't know is of any additions.

Chas: If there is regulations for that?

Rodger: If there is regulations for that type of facility in our Zoning.

Andy: What do you do for noise?

Rodger: There is a Noise Ordinance in the Township.

Andy: That's right.

Rodger: If you have an issue with noise all you have to do is call the Sheriff and the Sheriff will come out and say yes, it is a nuisance and they will enforce our Noise Ordinance.

Andy: But the Sheriff says to get a hold of the Township.

Rodger: No, the Sheriff was made aware and has been aware and said they WOULD enforce the Noise Ordinance in the Township. That's why the Township activated a Noise Ordinance in 1906, I believe and there was a Noise Ordinance prior to that also.

Sandra: If you have Zoning issues, shouldn't those be addressed to the Zoning Board? Because the Zoning Board figures things out and then brings their findings to the Trustees.

Andy: Well, I'm going to -----

Sandra: You are skipping a step.

Tom: I have received the written complaints, Mr. Zarin. I am investigating it. My investigation isn't complete. Parts of those questions are a questionnaire to the Lake Hill Club requesting that I could do an on sight escorted inspection. For dates the best they could tell they began skeet shooting, rifle range, rifle shooting and other agriculture activities like propagate birds and those things would be exempt. My over simplification is if you picked 1994 when the Township adopted Zoning that the non-conforming use sort of gets frozen in time. In 1994 all those facilities and activities because of the uses they are not conforming to our new Zoning Code, they are not illegal. If they want to operate that Club frozen in time and maintain those facilities or even replace those facilities for example the mobile home, if there is a mobile home up there. I think they could replace it with a similar size mobile home if it became deteriorated. If they want to operate that Gun Club and stay frozen on time like 1994 same facilities and same uses. I think they could do that for purity. I think they can't build new structures that aren't agricultural. I think they can't grow their facilities without a BZA action.

Andy: They have grown, multiplied and expanded.

Sandra: This Board can't take any action until we have his report and we know what is going on.

Tom: You've seen my report and if you think my report is odd. I think your action probably needs to go to the BZA. You'd go to BZA and say you don't think Mr. Brown, has done his job and ask the BZA to overturn my opinion or edit my opinion.

Andy: But for the time being, going through you is the proper channel?

Tom: Yes, I believe so.

Rodger: Your actions requesting special occasions on the Rifle Ranges, whatever, those should be addressed to the Zoning Commission for an update of the Zoning Resolutions. Which gives the Zoning Inspector something to go by?

Andy: Well, I think what I am going to do is send a letter to the State Board of Registrations for Engineers and Surveyors and have an investigation made and I will bring up some of those issues. I'll send a copy to the Township Trustees, Zoning Inspector and you will be advised as to what my thinking is. But I think there have been some people involved primarily with the Don Percy case and I think they should be prosecuted for practicing Engineering without a license.

Rodger: That I cannot answer.

Sandra: But this isn't Trenton Township.

Chas: Okay Andy, time is up.

Andy: Thank you.

Chas: If there any other guest who would like to speak?

Rodger: Uh, We didn't do a motion to approve the minutes of the Mach 10, 2010 meeting as presented by the Fiscal Officer.

Sandra: I'll second. Vote: unanimous.

Rodger: I will make the motion to approve the minutes of the Special Meeting of March 27, 2010 for purpose of hiring summer help as presented by the Fiscal Officer.

Sandra: I'll second the motion. Vote: unanimous.

FISCAL OFFICER REPORT: Susan Beckley

The Delaware Regional Planning bill that was \$2,539.00, there was no money allocated in the Appropriations for that under membership dues. So at this time I have taken it out of a different General Fund Zoning Account. I need a motion so we can allocate the money for a new Appropriation. I haven't taken our updated Appropriations in because I know this was coming up.

Rodger: So you need a supplement Appropriation?

Susan: Yes, for \$2,539.00.

Sandra: So moved.

Rodger: I will second. You fill in the account numbers.

Susan: I can do that. Vote: unanimous.

Susan: Our insurance check for the Siren came in and was put in the Fire Fund. I have to raise the appropriations in that account. The account 2191-760-740 is Equipment and we need to raise that appropriation by \$12,676.00 to cover the check I have written the check for tonight's meeting. I need your blessings.

Rodger: So moved.

Sandra: Seconded Vote: unanimous.

Sandra: On the siren, I did get us a \$1500.00 off the original quote.

Rodger: Did we get the check for that?

Sandra: Long time ago.

Susan: Check came in February. I just need to transfer the funds.

Susan: Last meeting we talked about the Insurance. Rodger opted out and I opted out. At that time I stated my insurance was \$49.00 per month. I had to go on Medicare F Plan which ran mine up to \$146.00. That is up to you if you are willing to reimburse me.

Sandra: I move we pay her insurance at the amount of \$146.00.

Chas: I second. Vote: unanimous.

Rodger: You got the account number? I would like to move \$10,000.00 into the Debit Service Account from 1000-910-910 into 4901-931-000.

Chas: I second. Vote: unanimous.

ZONING INSPECTOR'S REPORT: Thomas R. Brown.

There was no BZA activity for March. There was no March meeting of the Scioto Township Zoning Commission for the month of March. There was no zoning applications and no zoning certificates issued.

Chas: Good, good.

Sandra: I've seen you in your office quite a bit here lately taking care of matters. I just want to thank you for the good job you are doing.

Tom: Thank you. Mr. Zarins is keeping me busy and the new construction going on.

FIRE CHIEFS REPORT: Marvin McIntire

Yesterday the Engines were serviced, the pumps were tested. They all passed the testing. Although Engine 374 needs some follow up work. It will not pass on paper until we get some follow up work done. Going to need some valve work and some seal work. I have one quote and waiting on the second. The first quote came in at amount \$4,200.00. Finley was in yesterday to do all of that, so they are also working on a quote.

The apparatus maintenance record book has been established. I went back to last fall and brought the records up today. The pump test and everything is recorded.

We will be making some small equipment purchases this month but they won't be over the P. O. amounts.

The last thing I got was a unique situation the other night. I had a couple of my guys come to me and I told them I would present this in a professional way. We had an open burn call on Monday night, April 12th late at night. The guys came to me and said they were intimidated and harassed over the whole situation. So the only thing I am going to say tonight is it was forwarded down to the Ohio EPA for an investigation follow up.

That is all I got.

Chas: Thank you.

OLD BUSINESS:

Sandra: Siren has arrived. Today the bracket was taken over to Consolidated Electric. They are installing the bracket at the end of the pole before they bring the pole over. OUPS has been notified they are going to mark everything for us. We have a nice big white square for them to do it.

Jim: They were here and marked it this afternoon.

Sandra: Oh, they marked it. Well, thank you.

Jim: I looked before I left the shop and it is marked okay.

Sandra: Boy they are quick. We are in good shape there.

Chas: Have you checked about the back-up system?

Sandra: I haven't opened up the box. The box is big enough for me to live in for a week. The bracket was in a separate box.

Chas: Do they have the siren or just the bracket?

Sandra: They just have the bracket. The siren is between the dump trucks. We are pretty excited about that.

Marvin: I have been working on the radio side of this project. The only think I don't understand is the DTMF on the radio. So we know our current desk high band portables and mobile that we can get 15880.0 and narrow band and lucky for us we will be able to Narrow ----- So that's going to cost about \$35.00. We just got to decide how many we are going to do. I really do not understand the DTMF side of this whole situation. I know there is a receiver on the siren and that the DTMF is keyed up somehow, but I don't know how and I need some help with that.

Sandra: That's okay. We are going to look and see what is in the box.

Marvin: But just on a good note we have radios here that are capable of narrow bands and we have license for 15880.0 also. The factory gave us there blessing, in talking the Chris about the situation and when we get this DTMF figured out then maybe Chris can explain that.

Chas: Does the siren manufacturer help in that respect at all or not?

Sandra: Oh, yes.

Marvin: Yes, he is giving me all the information I just don't understand that DTME fide of it.

Chas: Okay.

Sandra: You wouldn't believe the amount of work that Chief McIntire has done on the radio side with all the people he has had to talk to and go through.

Chas: Good.

Sandra: I'll just be happy when it is up.

Marvin: We'll get this figured out.

Chas: Anything else, Sandra?

Sandra: The cleanup day is coming up, the day before Mother's Day, May 8th; everything has been set up with Sargent's for the bins.

Chas: Do we have it here?

Sandra: We have it at Second Street. It is just a drive thru thing just for residents. The Newsletter is going out with the announcement about it. I've had people calling me already asking when it will be held. I tell them it is the day before Mother's Day always. I think this is like the eighth year we will be doing this project.

Chas: How many dumpsters?

Sandra: We call for two (2) first and we have a third one on call if we need it. The last several years we have only needed the two. So, people are getting geared up for that.

Chas: Dragon Speak?

Sandra: Dragon Speak, it would not take it directly off the recorder. We hooked the recorder right up to the computer. It kept saying "did you say something". What I did this last month was listened to the tape and re-read everything it said into the computer and the computer wrote it out. It was basically listening to the tape and repeating it. Then going back and putting in the punctuation and that sort of thing.

Chas: Not bad for the first time.

Sandra: No, not bad for the first try. Like to see about a digital recorder and maybe that would put it in a format that it could understand easier. But we will just keep working at it tweaking that. I think Susan was happy with it.

Susan: Sure.

Sandra: I am happy with it and just keep going forward from there.

Chas: Stone for the park. We need to get a thank you letter out the National Lime and Stone for the sixty-three (63) tons of stone that was donated. What is your opinion on finished it up with our money?

Sandra: About how much more do we need?

Chas: Have you seen it?

Rodger: I haven't had a chance to go back up.

Chas: All the parking areas are pretty much done, nothing down over the hill. The parking areas are done. They are compacted, rolled and they are nice. On Thursday I took the bulldozer up there and gave it one last go through and Jim rolled it. It's pretty

tight. The 574's went down very nice. The only thing it basically needs attention is the main thoroughfare. So as far as I am concerned they could get a light tail gate. But the other areas needed the attention. They needed re-worked, torn up and pot holes fixes. It's nice.

Sandra: It is nice.

Chas: But we should probably take a look at -----

Rodger: How much more do you think you will need?

Chas: My guess would be probably tops would be thirty (30) tons. 574'S runs about \$9.00 to \$10.00 a ton.

Rodger: Don't have that with me, so I don't know what our price is.

Jim: They are not on our price sheet.

Rodger: Oh, 574'S aren't?

Chas: I am thinking they are pretty close to \$10.00. They are between a 4 and a 57 price wide. So if we say \$10.00 for Thirty (30) tons.

Rodger: \$300.00 bucks?

Chas: Start at the road and work our way back. That's the most important parts.

Sandra: That will save us from getting more pot holes in the future.

Chas: Right, now the base is stabilized, but it needs top dressed. Just like you do your roads.

Sandra: I think we should go for it.

Chas: I think it is money well spent.

Jim: Chas, can I bring something else up?

Chas: Sure.

Jim: At the front of the road where it comes out on the blacktop you guys put. We need to put a trench across there to divert the water either way. Not let it run out on the blacktop. We need to put some kind of a trench in there. Do you understand what I am saying? When Junior put the blacktop the trench was suppose to go east and let the water into the culvert that runs down 36. If we put something in there to divert the water the other way. The water would not be washing out on the road.

Chas: Can we crown that before it hits the blacktop?

Jim: We can crown it or put a ditch down through there underneath the fence.

Sandra: I think that's a good place for Junior to start.

Jim: Junior is very familiar with it. If we put some kind of ditch, instead of running it back east and then come back down. It's better off to put some type of ditch coming down the west side of the road where that tile-driveway. Then we won't have to worry about it. There is no traffic there and all you would have to do is go under the fence and you will have to put something across the driveway.

Chas: Right.

Jim: You'll need a French drain or a metal drain or whatever.

Chas: Get a piece of schedule 40 and drill some holes in it.

Jim: Just need something for the water to drain into, to shut it off. You get a heavy rain it comes out of the east driveway and drains down there too. So if you can divert it and keep it from going out on the highway that is the main thing.

Chas: Thanks Jim.

Sandra: Thank you sir.

Chas: I make the motion to get approximately thirty (30) more tons of gravel for the park.

Rodger: Well we will have to change our appropriations. I think we can probably do it. Might be available.

Sandra: I second the motion. Vote: unanimous.

Sandra: Under old business, I made copies of the schedules of the Baseball Teams and the Lacrosse Team and a copy of the Park Rules. Jim took them over and put them on the bulletin board.

Jim: They are on the board.

Sandra: I saw that.

Jim: I also got them blown up.

Sandra: Oh, just because you couldn't read them

Jim: The copy machine we have got works to make things readable.

Chas: Junior, we are going to start on Monday, correct?

Rodger: I think so.

Sandra: I think we can use him now.

Rodger: The cemeteries, you know, going to kick us.

Jim: Two of them are mowed right now.

Rodger: They need weed eaten too.

Jim: Yes, they need weed eaten.

Chas: One thought I had also, if we do pot hole patching and road repair should we check with the Village about possibly assisting them for a fee while we have Junior on board and I have the equipment out and doing some of that. I notice there is quite a bit.

Rodger: I don't know whether -----

Chas: Mike, do you have any input on that or have you guys talked about it.

Mike: It was brought up at Council and we'll have to give you a price.

Chas: You give us a price or we give you a price?

Mike Give me a price for doing the work.

Sandra: I think it is a good idea.

Chas: Do you have a pacific area yet or not. Can you make a list?

Mike: I'll get a list. We are going to do some major paving this year. Three of the main side roads will be paved and resurfaced this summer. Second Street will be done in the fall.

Chas: That is something that the ones that need attention now.

Mike: They said that they are going to be paved just fill the holes in temporary until they get them paved. Providing it will probably be June before they start the paving on Carr Street, Hill Street and I forget the other Street.

Sandra: Would you like me to talk to Mayor Crile about it?

Chas: I think that has already been set. Mike just has to come up with the list.

Mike: Whoever is going to do it for the Township needs to come up with a price?

Chas: Give Junior the list or one of us and then we can come up with a price for the Village.

Mike: Okay.

Chas: What were you going to say Rodger?

Rodger: I don't know if cold patch is available at this point or not, we may have to go – are the blacktop plants running?

Chas: Some of them are.

Mike: They will start in the next week or two probably.

Rodger: I was going to say, I didn't know.

Jim: You can get cold patch anytime you want it.

Chas: But I'd rather go with 404's and have it done right. Cold patch is only temporary. Rodger do you want to talk about Old Business or the Reclaimer?

Rodger: We can do it under Old or New Business. Uh, Dexter has this type of implement called the Claw and what it does is pulls the old berm material back on the sides toward the roads.

Sandra: Where to snow plows put it?

Rodger: Where everything puts it. Uh, I talked to Mike Graham and he said it was about four (4) weeks out to get one. They won't get a demo in unless they have a Purchase Order and we pay for it and he said they would give us our money back if we weren't happy with it. So, at this time I'd like to issue a Purchase Order on it. The cost of the unit is \$6,860.00. I know we spent over \$12,000.00 last year on berm material. Which if this will reclaim half of it we could probably pay for this thing in two year.

Sandra: I will second that.

Chas: I would like to see if we could get the money back guarantee extended to two weeks instead of one week.

Rodger: I think we will find out pretty much real quick. I told him if ----

Chas: If we get a wet week.

Rodger: If we get a wet time he'd extend it. He did say he would extend it. That was verbal.

Chas: As long as we get that extension, I think it is going to work for us.

Sandra: He is with Dexter.

Rodger: Yes, Mike Graham.

Sandra: We have done a lot of business with Dexter's. I really don't think they would give us grief about it. They would want to keep our business.

Jim: Rodger, do we have a big enough tractor?

Rodger: Yes, the TN65 will take it.

Jim: Well I wasn't sure.

Rodger: I asked that question. He said a 35 horse power tractor would take care of it.

Jim: See, when I talked to them a long time ago, they did not know what our horsepower was on any of our tractors.

Rodger: Uh, that's got a category three hitch on the back and this only takes a category two.

Brenda: Anyway they would buy one for a demo?

Rodger: They won't buy one for a demo unless we issue a Purchase Order and then buy it. If it doesn't do the job we expected it to do, they will buy it back for what we paid. I've been trying to get a demo out since last fall.

Chas: I think it is a good idea and we should issue a Purchase Order and make a motion.

Rodger: Motion is there.

Sandra: Rodger make the motion and I seconded the motion.

Fiscal Officer: Vote please. Vote: unanimous.

P. O. Number 09-04-2010 Dexter's \$6,860.00

Chas: I was up and basically went thought that mower at the park. I think with Junior on board this year, I think we ought to rest it for a year.

Rodger: Rest it for a year, Okay, that is fine.

Chas: I think a little bit of TLC we can provide we can diffidently make it another year.

Rodger: Okay, that's fine.

Rodger: Next on my list, are we in New Business now?

Chas: Yes.

Rodger: DeGood Road, the original cost estimate they came back with uh, for widening and preparing the surface, it was \$656,810.00. After talking to Jerry Ungashick, he gave us revised quotes by changing some of the you know, uh, the quantities on the surface treatment. Came back with \$601,370.00 as a quote for submitting to OPWC for a grant in 2011 so at this point I would like to make a motion we go ahead and apply for the OPWC Grant using the \$601,370.00 and our contribution would probably be close to \$51,370.00. Typically there are no grants given over \$500,000.00. So, it is either that one or go with the Carr Road widening. You should have a copy of that also, for the Grant Application and their estimate was \$492,140.00.

Chas: I think DeGood Road. You look at the -----

Rodger: I'd like to go with DeGood Road first, but Carr Road gets a lot of traffic, but it is in better shape than DeGood.

Chas: I think DeGood has got better priorities.

Sandra: I don't know, have you been on Carr Road in a snow plow?

Rodger: Yeah.

Sandra: It is icky.

Chas: DeGood has probably got more imperfections as far as road surface. Base and everything else. I agree with Rodger, I will second that motion to apply for the OPWC Grant.
Vote: unanimous

Rodger: Save Carr Road for hopefully next year's Grant application?

Chas: Yes.

Sandra: See if you can get another lane in it.

Chas: Back to Junior, did he make it through his drug and alcohol test?

Fiscal Officer & Rodger: Yes.

Chas: Did he pass?

Fiscal Officer & Rodger: Yes, he did.

Chas: Another thing I have for Old Business, did we ever get any revised quotes by changing the deductibles on our Insurance? He was supposed to give us from the last meeting. He was supposed to have it back to us in a week and I haven't seen anything so far.

Fiscal Officer: I haven't seen anything, Chas.

Chas: Do you know what I am talking about? He was going to change the deductible amounts and give us some ideas on what our premiums would be if we raised our deductibles on some of our vehicles.

Sandra: On some of the vehicles, oh yea, I'm with you.

Rodger: I haven't seen anything.

Sandra: That was Gary.

Chas: Will you make a call to him, Susie?

Susan: Yes, I'll call Jim, no it was Gary Walters.

Sandra: It was Gary Walters.

Rodger: I remember you asking that but I haven't seen anything, didn't know if you'd gotten anything or not.

Chas: He said he'd have it to us in a week.

Fiscal Office: I have not seen anything.

Chas: He's got his check – so he is good to go. Anything else.

Rodger: Larcomb Road Culvert: I think you guys got a copy of that. I haven't heard back from Phil Viers, whether or not he has gotten the culvert in. It is starting to dry up out there and I would like to get that done here in the next couple of weeks if it is dry enough.

Chas: I agree.

Rodger: If we get a pretty much whole crew in here next week. Get the cemeteries knocked out, possibly by the end of the week. Possibly we can get Larcomb Road done. Should only take one work day to dig it out and replace.
