# Honoring the past...



## LITTLE BROWN JUG

Thanks to the vision of founders Joe Neville and Henry "Hank" Thamm, the Little Brown Jug has become "America's Pacing Classic". E. K. "Bull" McManara led the construction that would become the world's fastest half-mile track in harness racing located on these fairgrounds.

Ensign Hanover captured the inaugural Little Brown Jug Pace in four grueling heats on September 18, 1946 at the Delaware County Fairgrounds. Delaware native and Hall of Fame horseman Wayne "Curly" Smart was the winning driver. Ensign Hanover was bred by Hanover Shoe Farms and owned by Castleton Farms.

Since then, every September harness racing's top stars have come to Delaware, Ohio to compete in their sport's greatest event on the world's fastest half-mile track. In 1959, Pacing's Triple Crown was formed and the Little Brown Jug became part of the series along with the Messenger and Cane Pace. Sports Illustrated wrote, "The Little Brown Jug is one of the Top 100 World-Wide Sporting Events every sports fan must attend in their lifetime."

# MC Fitness & Health

- \* Built by Mount Carmel Health System
- \* 130,000-square-foot complex offering a fitness center and a medically integrated approach to health
- \* Includes Delaware County's second emergency-room facility
- \* Opened Jan. 19, 2016





## Nationwide Children's Hospital and OhioHealth facility in Lewis Center

70,000-square-foot operation will house separate emergency rooms for children and for adults



Will include specialty clinics, developmental therapies and lab services for children

Completion projected for early 2017 and represents a \$16.5 million investment in the county

A proposed development in Orange and Berlin townships that will build a walkable neighborhood with housing, retail and office locations, a school and a community/fitness center




# Evans Farm Town Center

# UPDATE: Big Walnut Interchange



A late 1980s study indicated the need for another I-71 interchange.

A feasibility study seven years ago came with too high a price tag.



Six months ago, another study showed it could be done at a more reasonable cost.

A construction project is still at least four years off, but the goal will be to facilitate commuter needs, not economic development.

# Accounting and Finance Improvements

ZBB: Zero-based Budgeting

Short-Term Planning: introduce monthly forecasts of cash flow and financial results for the rest of the year after each month's end

Long-Term Planning: introduce five-year projections of cash flow and financial results every year

# Accounting and Finance Improvements

Central Purchasing: look for efficiencies across all departments and lower costs with smarter purchasing decisions

Leveraging Staff Expertise: In the Human Resources and Facilities areas, reduce risk exposure and costs by leveraging the expertise of the county's own experts
